This should be the last Newsletter of the 2020 season. It was a summer of great racing and deficiency of social interaction. We have a lot to make up for next year!

Our last race of the season finished with as much excitement as we have come to expect. Conditions, although more moderate, were similar to the previous weekend with strong winds and random, robust gusts.

Five boats assaulted the start line and took off at high speed. The race quickly turned into two duels. The first of these was between the Hall and Hogg crafts with the Hoggs pulling away and Warren and Brad closing their lead over the last two legs of the race, so much so that the finish positions, again with the two boats on different tacks, was difficult to predict, and more difficult to judge. In the end, Hoggs took first place by about 16" or one one tenth of a second. Intense and wonderful competition!

The second battle started out with three boats; however the Douglas/Houlden Team withdrew after one lap. The Johnson boat, again crewed by brothers Ted and Paul, capsized early on allowing Dean MacMurtry and crew, nephew Dave Jeffries, to slip into third place until they, in turn, capsized. Johnsons then were able to reclaim third position which they held to the finish with MacMurtry taking fourth.

Almost every boat improved upon its score from 2019 which is highly commendable and an indication of the level of competition and dedication of these teams. This improvement, I feel, is due at least in part to the scoring system introduced last season by Rob Ballagh which allows all teams to easily and accurately keep track of their points from week to week.

Next summer will hopefully bring more boats to the course. In the works for the upcoming season are the following:

- -race training for captains and crew
- -introduction of handicap system for non-albacore boats
